Arthur Hayward, the veteran Cambrian Male Voice Chorister, passed away on 7th March 2011. He was a founding member of the choir and joined Cambrian Male Voice in 1947 while they were practising out of a house in Jones Street. He was a former miner at Cambrian Colliery. His pitch perfect baritone voice allowed him to lead the choir at any time, in any situation.
